Four Chaplains Memorial Service



On February 6, 2011 a memorial service was held in honor of the four chaplains connected with the sinking of the USAT Dorchester and attended by our base Chaplain, Jim Amason. From the service program:

On February 3, 1943, the USAT Dorchester was tragically sunk by the German U-Boat U223. Of the 902 young men onboard, only 230 survived. Many of those survivors owe their lives to the courage and leadership exhibited by the heroic Four chaplains, who, in sacrificing their lives created a unique legacy of brotherhood.

This service honored all who have served and whose courage and faith have sustained our country.
